## Nundle - LOH Ride

Nundle is a scenic village and has a wonderful reputation for country hospitality from its small population of around 300 people.

The peace and quiet, beautiful hills, and boutique businesses in and around Nundle are just some of the attractions.

You don't have to look far to experience remnants of the gold mining and grazing heritage of Nundle and surrounds. Among the oldest surviving buildings in Nundle are The Peel Inn, the Nundle Woollen Mill, Odgers and McClelland Exchange Stores and Mount Misery Gold Mine Café. Nundle Courthouse (former) and Police Station have been placed on the Register of the National Estate.

This is great easy country ride to and from Nundle, Past Chaffety Dam through some of Tamworth's most beautiful countryside.

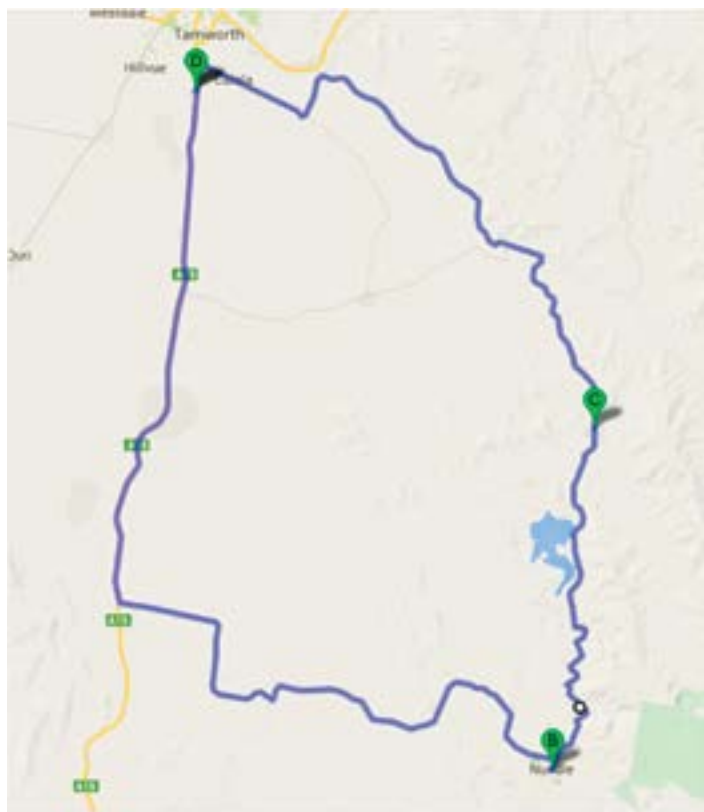

## Lake Keepit via Manila

This Chapter led Guided Ride takes you north from Tamworth along Fossickers Way through the sleepy town of Manila and stops at the unexpected Lake Keepit for a scenic break.

The name 'Manilla' comes from the Gamilaraay language, and is said to mean 'winding river' as it sits on the junction of the Namoi and Manilla Rivers.

Lake Keepit is a local recreation area for boating, fishing, sailing and all water sports. Surrounded by kilometers of pastoral and timber country, it is a picturesque location filled with many native plants, trees and local wildlife including echidnas and emus. The dam's purpose includes flood mitigation, hydro-power, irrigation, water supply and conservation.

This Guided Ride is one for the nature loving riders.

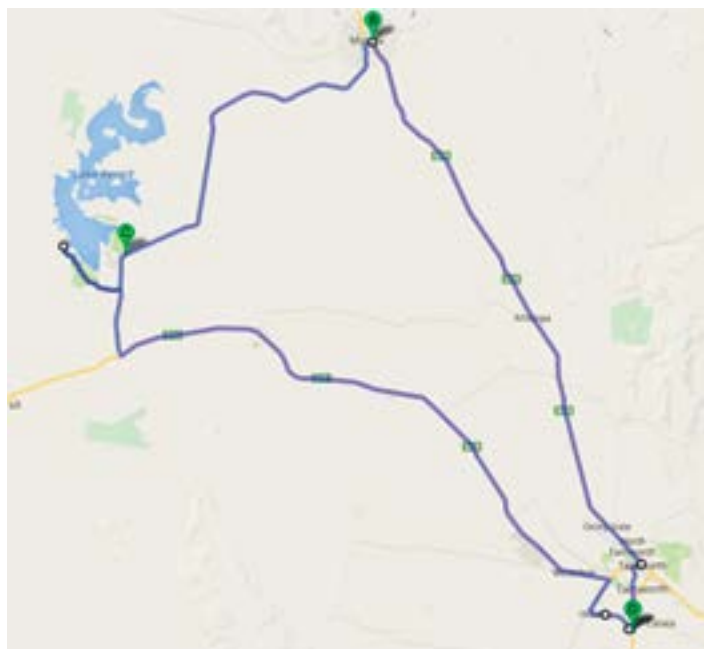

## Uralla

Uralla is a classic Australian country town and its name was taken by European settlers from the dialect of the local Anaiwan people and means 'meeting place'.

It is full of charm and colourful characters, a perfect stop on one of our Chapter led Guided Rides.

While having your break in Uralla visit the New England Brewing Company or just take in the historical architectural buildings in the main street.

Or you could visit the infamous 'Captain Thunderbolt's' (Frederick Ward) grave in the old Uralla Cemetery (John Street). Captain Thunderbolt was an infamous bushranger in the 1800's. There are many references to Thunderbolt throughout the town, and the locals are quite fond of the legend. His mysterious life makes interesting reading.

Uralla is a fascinating town with lots to see and do... you'll love the history on this ride.
